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The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Wednesday, August 13th to Friday, August 15th, 2025, among a sample of 805 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Edmonton. The survey was conducted using smart IVR. Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Edmonton.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.5% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample. Totals may not add up 100% due to rounding.

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Majority of voters support relocating Lucy the Elephant, agreeing with veterinarian experts


An outright majority of voters who expressed an opinion (68%) expressed a preference for Lucy the Elephant to be relocated to a warmer climate, with 73% of voters who expressed an opinion saying that they are more likely to support a candidate that supports relocating Lucy. Support for relocation was highest with voters age 50-64 and voters under 50.

Additionally, 64% of voters who expressed an opinion do not think it is ethical to keep Lucy in Edmonton if upgrades are not made by the Edmonton Valley Zoo to where she lives. Disagreement with the ethics of keeping Lucy in Edmonton was highest with voters under age 50, as 67% of voters under age 50 who expressed an opinion thought it was unethical to keep Lucy at the Edmonton Valley Zoo.

While voters were divided on the question of if it is a good use of municipal tax dollars to keep Lucy at the Zoo, with younger voters being the largest group saying it was not a good use of tax dollars (56% of those with an opinion). With younger voters also being the largest group supporting Lucy being moved, it can be concluded that those voters want Lucy moved somewhere else, as it is more ethical and has a lower cost to taxpayers.




Did you vote in the last election for the Mayor of Edmonton? (All voters)



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

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
